Note: *Unless noted in the award requirements, all submissions must be sent to the appropriate chairman by May 6th. It then becomes the responsibility of each chairman to forward the Summary Sheet as well as the best three reports to the Department Chairman for judging by the date she selected.*

Judging: *Unless noted in the award requirements, the Department Trophy and Awards Chairman will contact three (3) Past Department Presidents, who remain anonymous to the membership, to objectively review and judge the annual reports prior to the annual convention.*

Please make sure you follow all instructions listed within the trophy requirements. (All attempts will be made to ensure each Department Trophy will be awarded.)

DEPARTMENT TROPHIES
& REQUIREMENTS

DORIS FOURNIER PROGRAM TROPHY:

Each Department Chairman will submit to the Department Trophy & Awards Chairman, as soon as possible after the return of the year end questionnaire/ the three most outstanding Unit Reports as well as the Summary Sheet. Reports will be evaluated and tabulated and the Unit receiving the highest number of credits will be awarded the trophy.

DEPARTMENT OF VERMONT HISTORY – ROTATING PLAQUE:

Awarded to the Unit for the best HISTORY submitted by the Unit historian

NOTE: The criteria changes annually based on current Department Historian rules. Watch for them in the Department Bulletin and Department website.

THE ETHEL DUGAN ROTATING TROPHY:

For the most outstanding CHILDREN & YOUTH report by due date. Award given to the Unit with membership goal set at 100 members or less. Must include a short narrative (250-500) best year-round children & youth activities (past 12 month only). It can be typed or handwritten.

PDP AWARD CHILDREN & YOUTH: Awarded to the unit with 101 members or more. Must include a narrative of 250-500 words including the past twelve months children & youth activities. Must be typewritten.

MERLE “TOOTIE” MC DERMOTT PUBLIC RELATIONS:

Presented annually to the Unit with the best report AND a scrapbook in the PUBLIC RELATIONS PROGRAM.

EVA BARTLETT TROPHY: Presented each year to the Unit making the greatest percentage of membership goal.

PEG A. CYR DISTRICT PRESIDENT PLAQUE: Awarded annually to the District President with the highest percentage of District Goal in membership at the time of judging.

MAXINE LECOMPTE/ALBERTA KENT CUMMINGS UNIT OF THE YEAR PLAQUE: Must have completed and/or participated in the following:

- Reached the Membership goal by January 31st which should include some juniors
- Made the following Department Contributions:
 - Children & Youth
 - Delegates Fund
 - Bonding
 - Donated to Department Presidents Project
 - Poppy proceeds sent into Department received in previous year
 - Poppies ordered for the current year
 - Some activity reported from each program
 - Roster of Officers & Chairman for current year on file at Dept. Headquarters

(Judging will be based on the Summary Reports submitted by Department Chairmen and records maintained at Headquarters.)

MARION TEAGUE JUNIOR AUXILIARY ROTATING TROPHY:

Awarded to the Junior Unit with the best History. Trophy to be presented at Junior Auxiliary Conference if one held, otherwise at Department Convention.

IRENE TRAYAH COMMUNITY SERVICE PLAQUE:

A rotating plaque to be awarded to the Unit reporting the best year-round Community Service Program. Report to be in narrative form not more than 500 words. TYPEWRITTEN, giving the Unit name, number, Unit chairman's name and address. NEWSPAPER Clippings AND PICTURES TO BE INCLUDED. This report must be mailed to the Department Community Service Chairman no later than May 6th.

MABEL PEARSON REHABILITATION TROPHIES:

One for Unit OVER 100 members. Best report for the year.

One for Unit under 100 members. Best report for the year.

EMELINE MORRISSEY GIRLS STATE TROPHY:

Awarded annually to the unit who sponsored the Governor for ALAGMGS.

VIRGINIA SHAMBO ROTATING CHAPLAIN AWARD:

1. Must hold opening and closing prayers at ALL meetings 25 points
2. Must contribute to a church in your community, or attend the Memorial Day service as a unit. 15 points
3. Must hold a Memorial Service for deceased members. (This is not just draping your charter / to funeral homes & conducting service, this is a service conducted just like The one held each year at Department's Convention only on a unit level). 40 points
4. Must enter a prayer book for judging. Prayer book must Be white with the Auxiliary emblem in the middle. Note- Book size (8.5X11). Pictures may be used, but please no obituaries. You may print the name of your deceased members for the year. 20 points

LOIS COUTTS NATIONAL SECURITY TROPHY:

To be awarded to the Unit with the best National Security Narrative Report.

- Supporting the USO & POW/MIA financial aid
- Honoring Policeman and/or Fireman
- Legible handwriting is okay or typewritten.

ANN BERRIO PAST PRESIDENTS PARLEY PLAQUE:

To be awarded to the Unit that gave care or consideration, in any manner, to a woman veteran, whether in her home, a nursing home, VA Hospital, Vermont Veterans Home in Bennington or wherever. All questions must be acknowledged on report. A few words must be written about what the Unit did for this woman veteran and the report must include the Unit's name and number, as well as the name of the Unit's Past Presidents Parley Chairman.

PAST DEPARTMENT PRESIDENTS' POPPY PLAQUE:

To be awarded to the Unit with the best poppy program. (Note – this award has been picked up by the Past Dept. Presidents and will be updated.)

SERVICE TO VETERANS PLAQUE: DEPARTMENT OF VERMONT

1. The Unit or member **MUST** have received the **SERVICE TO VETERANS ORIENTATION COURSE**.
2. The Unit submitting the best year-round report of service to the Veterans in their community. This can include local hospital, halfway houses, the Vermont Veterans Home in Bennington and the Veterans own home.

This is for Units whose goal is 101 members or more that was set by the Department of Vermont.

DEPARTMENT OF VERMONT AWARD:

The Unit must submit a narrative indicating their participation in all three programs listed below:

- VA & R
- Service to Veterans
- Rehabilitation

BETTY HALEY - #1 Goal District President Plaque: (Two plaques)

To be awarded to the District President whose district make 100% goal first.

- SMALL PLAQUE – to be given to the District President to keep
- LARGE PLAQUE – rotating plaque to be given each year to the first District to make 100% of membership goal.

VERNA DUPREY LEADERHIP AWARD:

To be presented to the Unit with the most outstanding Leadership Program.

RULES:

- Unit shall have read department Bulletin LEADERSHIP message at meetings.
- Unit shall have held a Leadership workshop OR
- Had some members in attendance at the Leadership Workshop offered by the current year Department Chairman
- Must submit a few words describing how the Leadership Program was performed in the Unit in carrying out the program and accompanied by the Unit YEAR END REPORT.

BETTY BAGINSKI AMERICANISM PLAQUE:

To be awarded to the Unit which reports the most outstanding Americanism Program within the community and includes the following:

- Contribution to the Spirit of Youth Foundation
- Promotion of Flag Etiquette
- Promotion of the Americanism Essay Contest

Pictures and original clippings from a newspaper on any project, which include the date and name of publication may be added but NOT mandatory.

TERRI ANN CHRISTIE AMERICANISM TROPHY:

Issued to the Unit that included Junior Members in their Unit Americanism Programs. A typed narrative report must be submitted describing their program and how they included their Junior Member. You may include pictures with this report. Send report to the Americanism Dept. Chairman.

NOTE: It is not required to have an installed Junior Unit, just active Juniors.

CHRIS HOWARD ROTATING AUXILIARY EMERGENCY FUND PLAQUE:

This is a rotating plaque to be awarded to the Unit with the best yearend report and narrative. The narrative for this plaque should be handwritten or typed, 150 words or more on the Unit's promotion of this program and how the goal was accomplished. Narrative must include the Unit's name, number and address, as well as the Chairman's name.

LYDIA ROBERTS CONSTITUTION & BYLAWS AWARD:

To be awarded to the Unit with the best report.

- Does your Unit recite the Preamble during opening ceremonies? (10 pts.)
- Does your Unit explain the meaning of Preamble to your new members? (10 pts.)
- Does your Unit explain the Unit Constitution by laws to new members? (10 pts.)
- Does your Unit take time to explain to the members how to write an amendment and how to write a resolution? (10 pts.)
- Does your Unit, on a regular basis, take time answer any and all questions, members have regarding the workings of the American Legion Auxiliary? (10 pts.)

Please write an essay of at least 200 words how you, as Unit Chairman present a study of your unit documents to your Unit members. Describe what tools you used as well as what method you used, and whether you believe this study was beneficial to the members. Please include all aspects of your unit document, including how to amend said document. This essay is worth (50) points.

BARBARA H. TREPANIER LEADERSHIP TROPHY: UNIT PRESIDENT'S VETERANS PROJECT: Plaque to include Unit President's name. Pin for the Unit President.

To encourage leadership in the American Legion Auxiliary, this award will be presented to the Unit and the UNIT PRESIDENT who organizes and completes the best Veteran's PROJECT or ACTIVITY in the current administrative year.

A short type written narrative must be sent to the Department Rehabilitation Chairman. Include VA&R, Service to Veterans and Rehab annual reports to show how this was reported. If there has been publicity for the project, a newspaper account(s) may be submitted which includes the date(s) and name(s) of the publications(s). Include sources of donations and expenses in the report, the amount raised if a fundraiser, number of veterans served. Any special event or activity will be considered.

Must be signed at the bottom of the narrative report by the Unit President and/or VA&R, Rehab, or Service to Veterans Chairman.

LYNN BARNES DEPARTMENT OF VERMONT CHAIRMANS YEAR END ROTATING TROPHY: This trophy will be awarded and rotated annually. The qualifications are:

- Current Vermont Department Chairman (PDPs are excluded)
- Submittal of a narrative YEAR END REPORT to Department Headquarters and to the Trophy & Awards Chairman by the cutoff date of May 6th.
- Report is not to exceed 500 words
- Must use WHITE 8 ½ x 11 bond computer paper.
- Black ink only
- No pictures, photographs or graphic are allowed.
- Must be typed and/or computer generated.
- Must include Unit accomplishments and Department accomplishments in their respective chairmanship.
- Monies, donations and other such information, if applicable, will be part of the narrative and NOT listed separately
- MUST BE SIGNED and dated at the end of the report.

AMELIA (AMY) MASON PHOTO HISTORY AWARD:

Unit Histories are due to the Department Historian by HER due date.

- Use standard three (3) ring binder, blue or black with
2 ½ or 3” Auxiliary Seal (Emblem) on the front cover (2) points
- Title page must contain the following:
History of _____ (Unit name & number, and Unit Historian’s name) 2 points
- Forward or dedication (5) points
- Photo Contents (Photographs Only) 75 points
Photos MUST cover from May 1st to April 30th of current year
MUST have complete coverage of Unit Activities
Chronological arrangement
Date should appear under the photographs
- Appearance of book - 10 points
Each grouping of pictures must be clearly identified
Neatness
Clarity of wording on captions
Originality
- Index, MUST be alphabetized, and placed before the signature page - 4 points
- Last page MUST be a separate sheet with only the signatures of the Unit President
and the Unit Historian. – 2 points

There WILL BE NO SPECIAL EFFECTS with the TYPEWRITER or COMPUTER.

Legible handwriting is acceptable.

NOTE: There will be an award for the Senior and the Junior Auxiliary.

LORRAINE “RANI” GRAY VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR ROTATING PLAQUE:

Presented annually to the Unit of any member in good standing, regardless of the position(s) previously held.

- Submit a narrative to the Trophy & Awards Chairman by due date
- Must cover only the current year
- May be typed or handwritten
- Pictures, newspaper articles, certificates/letters of appreciation may be included

PAT SHERMAN EDUCATION AWARD:

To be awarded to the Unit whose report reflects the most outstanding Education Program within the community. Unit must write or type a brief account of their Education Program. Included in the narrative must be examples of your Unit participation in the categories noted below. You may include monies spent or donated as well as hours, if appropriate. This narrative is to be submitted with your end of the year report for Education. You may also include anything else in the Education Field not listed below in your narrative. Scoring is done a point basis for a total of 100 points. In case of a tie in points, selection will be made on the content of the narrative by the Past Presidents.

1. Scholarship Program - 30 points
 - a. Distribution of available scholarships to at least one school
 1. National President scholarship – 5 points
 2. Spirit of Youth – 5 points
 3. Non-traditional – 5 points
2. Participation in at least one of the following National Programs 15 points
 - a. Literacy 5 points
 - b. Classroom Mentoring and Reading 5 points
 - c. Veteran in the classroom 5 points
3. Participation in at least one of the following: 30 points
 - a. American Education Week 10 points
 - b. Teacher Appreciation Week 10 points
 - c. Educator of the Year 10 points

CANDY HUSEMAN LEGISLATIVE PLAQUE:

To be awarded to the unit with the best report; to include:

1. Action including copies of letters sent to Senators & Representative (National & State) in support of legislation for our Active Duty, Veterans & their families; especially when so requested by the American Legion and/or the American Legion Auxiliary. Bonus points will be given for copies of letters and/or emails received from Senators & Representatives.
2. Copies of letters placed in newspapers, bulletins, post newsletters, etc. to bring about awareness to the public of problems requiring support to Active Duty, veteran's and their families.
3. Report any special programs your unit did to promote Legislative activities for the good of the Community, State and Nation, preferably during the month of January (but not mandatory) which is our legislative month.
4. Report any "Get Out and Vote Programs" your unit may have done, to include posters, letters to the editor, and assisting at the polls, bringing people to the polls, etc.

POINT SCORING SYSTEM FOR TROPHY:

- 50 Points – for each copy of letter or email sent to a Senator or Representative
- 25 points – for each copy of a reply from Senators or Representatives
- 25 points – for each copy of a letter to the editor, bulletin message, post newsletter, etc. supporting Veteran Legislation
- 25 points – for a narrative on your GET OUT and VOTE program (short narrative)
- 25 points – for a narrative on any special programs promoting Legislative activities.

Bonus points 10 each for every Legislative activity done in the month of January.

DEB TIERNAN AWARD FOR "SERVICE NOT SELF":

A rotating plaque awarded to a Unit that best exemplifies the following:

Who we are, what we do, and why we matter!

Please send a narrative (include pictures) describing what your Unit did this year in supporting the many programs of the American Legion Auxiliary. Show your pride in being members of the world's largest women's service organization. Remember, "In the Spirit of Service, Not Self".
